
FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hello everyone,

Welcome back to term 3 at Hagley Farm School. Let's hope that this term is a calmer and less eventful one – where we are able to focus together on learning at school. It has been wonderful to welcome our students back to school today – and we are excited for what this term will be for us as a learning community. Yesterday our teaching staff made some significant professional learning commitments for this term. We are always grateful to have the opportunity that student free, professional learning days provide for us – and we thank you for your support with these opportunities.

Yesterday we welcomed Mr Ryan Lee to our school team as our new Assistant Principal for the remainder of the year. His main role is to oversee the Primary grades and support teaching, learning and wellbeing for students and teachers. He is certainly looking forward to getting to know all of our students in the next few weeks. I am sure he will welcome conversations with parents and carers too.

We are still implementing a range of strategies to ensure that health and safety is our priority, alongside learning. We have strong processes in place within the school for staff, students and visitors to maintain hygiene and safety. However, to support our processes, we are encouraging adult visitors to really consider their purpose for visiting. The school is a safe place, and we hope to keep it so. Parents are able to come back onto our school site - but we encourage you to do so only when necessary. Drop offs and pick ups at the classroom are allowed, but we ask you to consider if this is necessary. Our reason is that if too many adults are at the classroom together then physical distancing will be difficult, and not adhered to.





In the past months we have seen the resilience and strength of students grow. Those who were apprehensive to come into school by themselves have grown to be able to do so. We love seeing this development in individuals. We have many ways of communication — so please consider your purpose before you come into school. We are absolutely available for parents, both teachers and members of the leadership team to discuss concerns and have check ins — but these might continue to be through alternative means than face to face, while we ensure everyone's safety for a little while longer. Our Stop, Drop and Go signage will still be on show in the carpark in the morning. If this is possible, please do so. Similarly, in the afternoon. Parents who come on site to meet their children must be physically distant to others.

School Banking is back. School Banking Day will be **Friday**, commencing on **24th July**






