FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hello everyone,

There has been such a buzz around the school about our Value of the Month – Courage. I have heard so many students discussing the meaning, commenting on the signs at school, pointing out the badges that staff are wearing, recognising the students that are awarded certificates for their courage, and able to share their thoughts about the courage that others show during our Assemblies. It is exciting to watch the learning grow and the concept of Courage develop. Every classroom is focussed on learning about this Value and making connections to the way we behave and learn at Hagley.

How have you shown courage recently? This would be a great two-way topic for discussion with your children.

Once again, I need to encourage parents to help us with our policy for wearing of our uniform. By and large we have an incredible percentage of students who wear our uniform with pride. They shine. Fissure Sealant and Fluoride Varnish Program Cancellation: COVID-19

Dear Parent/Guardian

Following the easing of restrictions with the Coronavirus (COVID-19), Oral Health Services Tasmania (OHST) are expanding the range of services provided but will operate at a reduced capacity. While we are operating at a reduced capacity and prioritising previously cancelled appointments, some less urgent treatment needs will continue to be postponed.

Unfortunately, this means that our school-based Fissure Sealant and Fluoride Varnish Program may not happen at your child's school in 2020. Rescheduling the FSFVP will depend on how long the impacts of COVID-19 crisis takes to reduce.

We will be working closely with the Department of Education to resume our program at your child's school when possible. You will be provided with an update as soon as we know more. If a return visit is not possible this year, OHST will plan to visit your school next year.

Limited services will still be available at our dental clinics. If your child requires an urgent or emergency dental appointment, please call 1300 011 013.

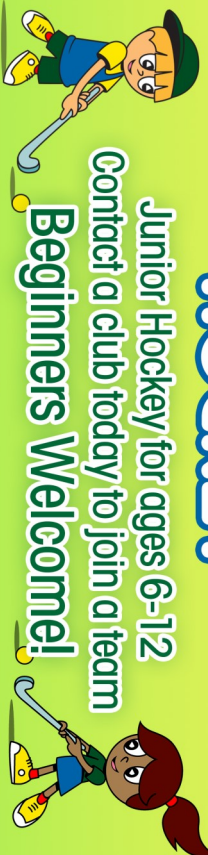
