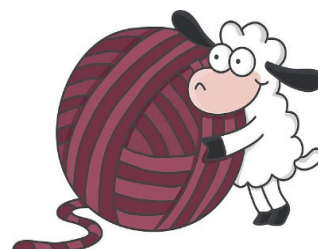

REVIEW INTO REPORTING TO FAMILIES: FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why is there a Review into Reporting to Families (the Review)?

The current Tasmanian Government School arrangements for reporting to families have been in place since 2007. In 2019 two key elements underpinned the establishment of the Review into Reporting to Families (the Review):

- A Department of Education (DoE) Assessment Strategy 2020-2023 was developed with one of the key actions to undertake a review of reporting to families with the objective of ensuring that learners and families are provided with meaningful, timely information on learning progress and achievement.
- DoE and the AEU reached agreement on the current teachers' award with one of the elements of the agreement a commitment from the Department to work with the AEU to undertake a review into reporting to families.

How long will the Review take?

The review period will be from July 2020 to March 2021.

What is the aim of the Review?

This Review aims to:

- Examine the purpose of reporting and whether current practice meets the purpose.
- Ensure learners and families are provided with meaningful and clear information on learning progress and achievement. This will include specific investigation of what is reported and the effectiveness of A-E ratings against national standards for this purpose.
- Ensure learners and families are provided with timely information on learning progress and achievement. This will include specific investigation of the usefulness of twice-yearly reporting to families for this purpose.
- Ensure clarity and consistency of approach across schools in relation to reporting to families, but also enable flexibility to suit local school contexts.
- Ensure teacher's time is maximised for quality instruction and in class assessment practices that progress learning and reduce the reporting workload.



Will the review involve consultation with key stakeholders?

The Review is committed to regular communication and consultation with key stakeholders to ensure they have access to up-to-date information and are given opportunities to share their voice and provide feedback.

Consultation with students, families, teachers and school leaders will begin in September and conclude in December 2020.

What will be the Review output?

A Review into Reporting to Families Report will be presented for consideration to the Minister for Education and Training by April 2021 – including recommendations on:

- Procedures for reporting student achievements and progress to students and families that are timely, efficient and manageable
- Measures of progress and achievement to be included in reports, both quantitative and qualitative
- Frequency of formal reports to families
- Format of formal reports to families
- Relationship between formal reports and other mechanisms for communication and engagement with families' eg online feedback

Are there any relevant Government legislation or rules that the Review must take into consideration?

The *Australian Education Regulation 2013* and the *Australian Education Act 2013* prescribe the minimum standards and other requirements that schools must comply with. This includes twice-yearly reporting against a five-point scale – these reporting requirements are tied to funding from the Australian Government.
