## FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK


Hello everyone,

It was a really positive start to our term yesterday. The majority of our students were with us at school, and excited about being back for learning. This is a really busy term, and we began with our Grade 3s, 4s, 5s and some 6s involved in their Swimming and Water Safety Program that will go for the next fortnight. These lessons are a compulsory part of the Health and Wellbeing Curriculum for these grades. We are very lucky to have the facilities at our school to focus on water safety for our students. This year our students will not be able to participate in further swimming lessons as other schools are using our pool facilities for their Swimming and Water Safety Programs. This has come about due to the earlier closures of pool facilities and the current need for DoE students to have access to this program.

Late last term I wrote about the ongoing restoration of our Olde Classroom. At the end of the term we discovered that there was much more water retention within the bricks of the building than we knew of. To alleviate this issue, and to dry out the building, means a very significant removal of the interior and exterior plaster and paint.

This process has been so exciting and wonderful to watch as the original building is emerging. We are describing the process as stopping the building's death and bringing her back to life. There has been significant damage done to the building over time through the works that have occurred that have not had a heritage focus to her ongoing life. From this time forward we are committed to only doing work that preserves and enhances her heritage.

We are very interested in learning more about the history of the building. The stripping back of the interior has shown so many parts of her timeline. But there is so much we do not know.





We are interested in learning so much more. Do you know of someone who went to school in the Olde Classroom? We want to hear from people who can tell us first hand stories of the classroom and the history of the changes. We are very happy for former students to visit and reminisce within the building while we record their memories. Please contact me through the school office if you are able to help us learn more.

The Tasmanian Government has announced the expansion of the Student Assistance Scheme (STAS), which waives the cost of Tasmanian Government levies for eligible students, for the 2021 school year.

The eligibility for STAS will move to using the Health Care Card or equivalent as the assessment mechanism, replacing previous income thresholds that applied.
