FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hello everyone,

Week seven – with four weeks left of the term.

Community Support for the End of Term This is such a significant time for us to finish the year positively, for students to continue to focus on learning, to focus on our Values and school expectations, to focus on friendships and connections. We ask that you have conversations with your children about the importance of resilience and kindness, of focussing on being positive, of the importance of learning right up until the last day of term. We really need your support to keep our school community continuing to be a place of positive behaviour – for learning, for play and for friendships.

Transition Activities

We have had several activities recently for our year fives and sixes to experience transition into high school. Prospect High School have provided several opportunities for them to participate in a day in the life of a high school student. These have been wonderful experiences — and we are grateful to Prospect for their focus on helping our students to understand the coming environment and learning opportunities. Transition to high school is so much more than orientation day. However, we do hope that our year six students heading to Prospect next year will have an incredible day tomorrow.

Class Placements

As we reach the last few weeks of the term staff are completing the allocation of students to classes for 2021. A reminder that class structures will be different in 2021 because of the changes in student numbers in our school and the necessity to ensure that classes have equity in numbers. We have worked hard in recent weeks to create the new model for 15 classes, and we





believe that the model that we have created will support all of our students and teachers in the best way. The final class placement information will be provided in the last week of term, along with end of year reports.

Community Health a n d Safety In the next 4 weeks our school community will be involved in a number of celebration activities, including the end of year Early Childhood Assembly, the Grade 3-5 Presentation Assembly, the Grade 6 Presentation Assembly, the Grade 6 Leavers Dinner and the traditional church services. We are focussed on ensuring that the health and safety of our community is critical, so there will be strategies in place for each of these activities to ensure physical distancing for adults and for the capacity of sites for numbers of people. Therefore, these activities will be different to past years, and we ask for your consideration in this. We know that you would love to be closely involved with your children, however this will not be able to be this year. We are sad for you, and with you. But we need to be as safe as we can be. We thank you for your consideration in helping us with this.

Place your order via the Qkr!App by Monday 14th December and we will send it home with your child before the end of term.




