### **Welcome Back Barbecue**

We are really pleased that next Tuesday evening we will be welcoming our school community back to Hagley Farm School for 2021. It has been a long time since we have been able to have large groups of adults together on our site, and we are very excited to be able to welcome you all back. Of course, the regulations from Public Health exist on our school site, therefore it is essential that throughout the evening all adults follow the expected protocols. All adults MUST either sign in to our site or use the Tas Check In App. Physical distancing is essential – adults must maintain 2m distance unless in a family group. When wanting to chat with your child's teacher, patience and distance must be adhered to. On the tractor rides smaller numbers of adults will be necessary and distancing must be organised on the tractor – and sanitiser must be used before boarding.

There will be a sausage sizzle available for families. All care will be taken to ensure health and safety is adhered to. Again, we ask for your support to ensure that our efforts are also mirrored by all adults. We look forward to seeing you all. For the evening to be a success we must have your support to ensure our site is safe and healthy. Thank you.

### **WELCOME BACK BBQ**

Our annual welcome back BBQ will be held on **Tuesday the 23rd of February**. Due to COVID-19 restrictions we need to limit the amount of adults in actual classrooms. As we are unable to ensure this, **we are not able to open classrooms** during the BBQ. Teachers will instead be found outside in a central area allowing your child to introduce their teacher to you and have an informal conversation about how your child has settled into the 2021 year. Teachers will also have an information brochure to hand out.

If you have a concern that you would like to discuss with your child's teacher, it is best to make an appointment for another day to enable the teacher to give you their full attention and adequate time.

Our Early Childhood classroom teachers (Kinder to Grade 2) will be available outside for a chat between 5.30pm and 6.15pm, followed by our Primary teachers (Grades 3-6) from 6.00pm to 6.45pm.

The BBQ will run from 5.15pm to 6.30pm.

There will be tractor rides available on the evening as well.

### **ALLERGIES- NUT AWARE SCHOOL**

**Context:** We have students in our school with life-threatening allergies – anaphylaxis to foods e.g. nuts. These reactions can be triggered by contact, ingestion or inhalation.

By being a nut aware school community we ask our school community to commit to;

- NOT sending foods to school that contain nuts. This includes peanut butter, coconut, nutella, all nuts and cooking oil containing peanut oil, as well as foods containing nuts.
- Explaining to children the importance of hand hygiene when eating food at home and at school.
- Encouraging students NOT to share food.
- Encouraging hand washing by staff and students after eating.
- Staff supervising eating at lunchtime. When teachers notice nut products being bought into the classroom a written reminder will be sent home to support the awareness of being a 'nut aware school'.
- Staff being made aware of students and staff who have anaphylactic responses, including nut allergies.
- Our first aid staff participating in first aid training in understanding and dealing with anaphylaxis (severe allergic reactions) as the need arises.

Hagley acknowledges that due to food processing practices it is impractical to eliminate nuts or nut products entirely from an environment where there is food. Many food packaging labels include the phrase 'may contain traces of nuts'. Foods with packaging labels that contain the phrase 'may contain traces of nuts' are acceptable.

### **ASSEMBLIES**

Our primary assemblies have commenced for the year, with early childhood assemblies starting next week. As was the case last year we are limiting adults attending these assemblies to those parents whose children are getting a merit certificate or who have a role in hosting the assembly. Parents whose child will be receiving a certificate will be sent an SMS alerting them about this; there is no need to reply to this message or no obligation to attend. They are simply sent as a courtesy. All adults MUST either sign in to our site or use the Tas Check In App.
