NAPLAN

I would like to congratulate our grade and 3 and 5 students and teachers for our participation in NAPLAN testing over the past week. This was a smooth week – students were calm and participated in the tests really confidently. The lead up and organisation was exceptional – which led to our groups of students feeling confident and supported. We did everything we could to ensure the best testing environment for our students, including the online demands, and they did really well. We are all very proud of their efforts.

STUDENT HEALTH AND ATTENDANCE

Please ensure that you are mindful of keeping students home from school when they are showing signs of being unwell. We have lots of children currently coughing, sneezing and with runny noses. While attendance at school is very important, to keep us ALL healthy we would appreciate it if children DO NOT come to school when they are unwell.

UNIFORM

As the weather is now becoming colder, I remind parents and families of the requirements of our Uniform Policy, endorsed by the School Association. Our uniform includes several items that provide warmth, including the rugby jumper and jacket. It is essential that these items are worn as the main provision of warmth. Puffer jackets, or the equivalent, are permissible to be worn to school in the morning as long as other items are also worn. They are not to be worn in classrooms therefore, another layer of uniform is necessary for warmth. As the cold weather increases it is still necessary that our attention to full school uniform is a focus for everyone.

Top five tips for parents to help keep their children safe online



Set time limits for using devices during non-school hours.



Keep your kids in open areas of the home when using their devices.



Turn on privacy settings to restrict who contacts your child in apps and games.



Join in with your child's online activities by co-viewing and co-playing.



Start talking to your kids about online safety the moment you hand over a digital device.

Commissioner Julie Inman Grant says there has been a 90 per cent increase in reports of online child sex abuse to her office since the pandemic started, and “something like 14,000 cases have been investigated that had to do with child sexual abuse material, the highest number ever; and we're on track for breaking that record”.

“Administrators on dark websites were celebrating the fact traffic on the sites was doubling and offenders started to share strategies about how to get kids online and particularly to live streaming platforms,” said Associate Professor Salter.

“Kids of six, seven or eight are clicking on a link that can take them straight to a live streaming site if they've got a webcam on the device”.


