Parent Teacher Student - 3 Way Meetings

Over the past few weeks, teachers have been busy making assessments of learning to write timely and relevant mid year reports for your information. Reports will be sent home in 2 weeks time for your early information, and then we welcome and encourage you to join us for our 3 way reporting conversations the following week. Information shared during the meeting will be relevant and appropriate to your child's learning and participation, therefore, whatever their age, they are able to be a part of the conversation. We encourage our students to be responsible for their own learning, therefore it is important that they are a part of the meeting. Preparedness for Short Term Lock Downs

Recently the DoE have encouraged schools to be ready in case we experience similar COVID related short term lock downs similar to Victoria. Schools will be classified as an essential service, and therefore will remain open for essential workers. We will also be required to provide online and paper based learning opportunities for learning at home. Please ensure that you are aware of your child's logon details for accessing Microsoft Office 65, Reading Eggs and Mathletics. We certainly hope that this situation will not occur in Tasmania, but it is essential that we are prepared.

Student Health and Attendance

Please ensure that you are mindful of keeping students home from school when they are showing signs of being unwell. We have lots of children currently coughing, sneezing and with runny noses. While attendance at school is very important, to keep us ALL healthy we would appreciate it if children DO NOT come to school when they are unwell.





School Uniform

As the weather is now becoming colder, I remind parents and families of the requirements of our Uniform Policy, endorsed by the School Association. Our uniform includes several items that provide warmth, including the rugby jumper and jackets. It is essential that these items are worn as the main provision of warmth. Puffer jackets, or the equivalent, are permissible to be worn to school in the morning as long as other items are also worn. They are not to be worn in classrooms; therefore, another layer of uniform is necessary for warmth. As the cold weather increases it is still necessary that our attention to full school uniform is a focus for everyone.


