FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hello everyone,

External School Review

Hagley Farm School will be involved in an External School Review between the 9th-11th of August. Every Tasmanian DoE school participates in a review process once every four years. The process is transparent and contributes to the realisation of the DoE's 2018-2021 Strategic Plan: Learners First: Every Learner, Every Day to inspire and support all learners to succeed as connected, resilient, creative and curious thinkers.

During the review the panel will meet with groups of teachers, staff, students and parents to ask a series of questions related to a specific inquiry. This gives a consistent approach to hearing feedback about the approach to learning in the school. The responses from groups and individuals are collated and affirmations and recommendations are made to the school based on the most common feedback. The review process is intended to support schools to strengthen our focus on learning and improve levels of achievement and growth. It provides schools with independent feedback about how we are performing. It provides an external perspective to verify or challenge our current improvement initiatives, the rigour of our improvement practices and our capacity to achieve and sustain improvements over time. The findings from the review are used to support the future planning for improving learning for our students and to provide recommendations for actions to move Hagley Farm School forward for the next four years.

The Reviews are not used to compare schools or to rate the performance of principals, teachers or school staff. They are about supporting schools in a differentiated way, with Reviews tailored to the context and need of each school.

We are looking forward to this opportunity to receive feedback from an independent group of DoE Principals and Leaders to support our planning for teaching and learning from 2022 -2025. If you would like further information regarding the review please contact me through the school office.

NEWS FROM THE FARM

Last Wednesday Mark Edwards from MJ Edwards Scanning spent time demonstrating some real life farming practices with groups of our grade 5/6 students and our Visitor Centre teachers.

Mark explained his business and how farmers hire him to scan lambing ewes. He took students through the process of moving the ewes through the run, scanning them and marking them, before practically demonstrating and then involving the students in the process.

Mark shared how his business can benefit farmers by better understanding how many lambs the ewes have, which might then inform farmers on feed and health & wellbeing management for the ewes prior to birthing.
