Yesterday our Grade 5/6 students experienced an amazing opportunity to work with a team from JCP-Empowering Youth. Their mission is to empower young people to become extraordinary versions of themselves through the delivery of high impact programs. And it was a highly impactful day.

Will Smith, the 2020 recipient of the Young Tasmanian of the Year, led the work for the day, and he was joined by two other young leaders – one who has recently struggled out of homelessness but is now making a great positive difference to his life and has begun attending school every day.

The messages throughout the day were positive, but challenging. We can't just be ordinary. We can't blame others for our pathway. We have to take our own responsibility for our own behaviours. We have to be responsible for how we respond to our circumstances. Are we angry and negative, or are we positive and looking for ways to make things better? Every day we need to look for ways that we can be a better person and help someone else. Are we a Battery or are we a Tap? Do we drain others, or do we energise them? Do we find ways to give energy to others or do we take it away from them? Working with a young leader, who has recently been released from Youth Detention, was enlightening. His resilience under extraordinary circumstances was inspiring to us all. His life path is positive thanks to Will with a n d his engaging team.

Yesterday was an opportunity for our young leaders of the future. We hope that our investment in working with JCP and the future learning within their classes will help every student to focus on looking forwards and becoming a better version of themselves, every day.

FUN RUN/WALKATHON





Tips for Parents to keep children safe

- ✓ Park the car in the safest legal place on the same side of the bus stop so students can get on the bus safely.
- ✓ Always leave enough room for a large bus to park.
- As a bus approaches, stick to the footpath and keep 3 metres between you and the edge of the
- When disembarking the school bus, remind children to wait until the bus has departed the stop before crossing the road, and to never enter the danger zone located directly in front or behind the bus.
- Always slow down when entering a school zone or nearing school buses - it's the law. A driver must not exceed 40 km/h within 50m of a bus displaying a school bus warning sign and/or flashing lights.
- Remember children at bus stops are the responsibility of their parent or guardian.



Bus Safety

When crossing the Road: STOP, LOOK, LISTEN & THINK

- Stop back from the kerb.
- Look right, look left and look right again.
- Listen for vehicles approaching. Think "is it safe to cross the road or not?"
- Wait until there is a safe break between traffic to cross.





Do stand well back when at the bus stop and vait until the bus has



Do wait until the bus moves away before crossing the road.

Don't cross the road in front of the bus or between parked cars.

At the bus stop:

- ✓ Walk, do not run to the bus stop.
- Stand well back from the road when waiting for the
- * Do not push or shove others when the bus is approaching the stop.
- ✓ Wait until the bus stops completely before going near the door.
- Get onto the bus in an orderly manner.
- ✓ Leave home with plenty of time to get to the bus stop. Accidents can happen when people rush.
- ✓ If your bus stop is in front of somebody else's property, be courteous, respect other's property and never leave rubbish behind.
- Always pay attention while at the bus stop.
- Have your money, ticket, card or free pass ready for the driver



On board the bus:

- Take your seat on the bus and stay in it while the bus is moving. If there are seat belts, you must wear them it's the law.
- Always show care, courtesy and good behavjour while on the bus.
- Always treat the driver with respect. They have the important job of getting you and others to school safely.
- Make sure bags, large instruments or sports equipment do not block the aisle or emergen-cy exits. Feet should be right in front of you
- × Never play with the emergency exits.
- If there is an emergency, listen to your driver and follow instructions.
- Hands should be kept to yourself at all times while riding in the bus.
- Fighting, bullying and verbal abuse will not be tolerated, these actions could see you banned from the bus.
- Respect other passengers with your noise level and behaviour.

Safety Rules Riding the Bus Exiting the Bus

Leaving the bus:

- ✓ Let the driver know when your stop is coming
- When getting off the bus, take three large steps away from the kerb and wait for the bus to leave before crossing the road.
- * NEVER cross the road in front of the bus.
- ✓ If you leave something on the bus, never return to the bus to get it. The driver may not see you come back and they may begin moving the bus. The driver will have your left item for you tomorrow.
- Make sure that drawstrings and other loose objects are tucked away and secure before getting off the bus so that they do not get caught on the handrail or the door
- Always remain 10 steps away from the bus to be out of the "Danger Zone" and where the driver can see you.
