But I am very proud to say that the initial report we received at the end of the three day review was overwhelmingly positive about the focus Hagley Farm School has to improve learning, specifically in Reading, Mathematics, Wellbeing and Engagement for our students. We had many students compete in the recent St Cecilia Performance Challenge with many great results.

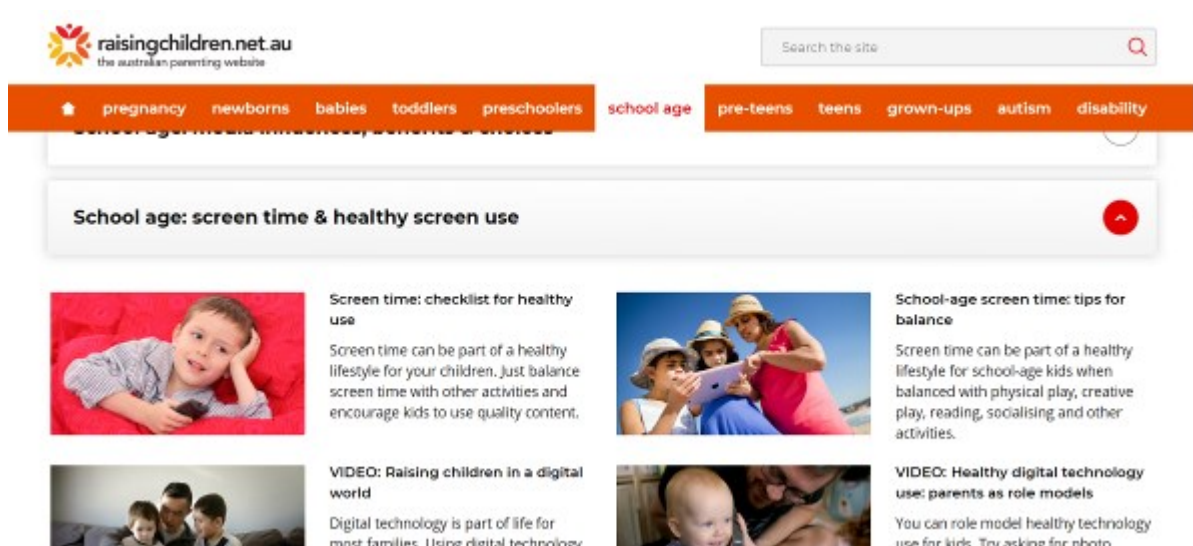

Ribbons to 4th place awarded to individuals in all groups – riders must compete in two (2) tests to be eligible. Shields awarded to the highest placed Primary & Secondary school team on the day as well as ribbons to 4th place for senior and primary teams. The shields for the school teams will be awarded to the following:

Senior Shield:

Will be awarded to the secondary school with the highest placed individuals but must include at least one (1) representative from either Group A or B.

Primary Shield:

Will be awarded to the primary school with the three highest placed individuals from any Group.

Riders must be a member of either Pony Club or EA to compete on the day. Riders not holding either of these types of membership will need to pay day insurance @ a cost of \$10 on the day.

❖ LPRC Conditions of Entry – not limited to but include:

- ❖ The event will be conducted under Pony Club (PC) Rules
- ❖ Horses must be ridden in a snaffle bit for dressage as per PC Rules
- ❖ Riders must represent the school they currently attend and the school must approve the entry
- ❖ Riders can compete with ONE horse ONLY and compete in a maximum of two (2) dressage tests only – from the same Grade (Group)
- ❖ Riders may ride as individuals as well as for a school team – to be eligible for individual or team awards, riders must compete in two (2) tests
- ❖ LPRC reserves the right to limit numbers
- ❖ This dressage competition can be used as a qualification for State Dressage Championships
- ❖ Changes of class and/or horse will need to be authorised by the Chief Coach of LPRC by Wednesday 15-9-20
- ❖ Please notify lprc@happond.com of any scratching's. There will be no refund of entry fees upon notification of a scratching unless a doctors or VET certificate is supplied
- ❖ Riders must present for a gear check prior to riding EACH test
- ❖ Riders are to ride in draw order – be on time and allow for scratching's
- ❖ Called test will attract a five (5) point penalty
- ❖ Riders are to ride in their school jumper or rugby top, shirt, tie, approved safety helmet (AS/NZS 3838, EN1384 (manufactured before 31-12-15), ARB HS 2012, ASTM F1163, SNELL E2001, PAS 015, VG1/VG01.040 (2014-12)) jodhpurs and riding boots
