FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hello everyone,

One of the priorities in our School Improvement Plan is to increase reading skills for all of our students - great readers and struggling readers alike. This has been a long term focus for our teachers exploring many strategies, with lots of learning taking place, for students and teachers. Reading is an essential skill- it opens up learning opportunities in every other area of the curriculum. We know that explicit teaching of reading every day is essential. But we also know that simply reading for enjoyment is a critical part of being a good reader. And here we are in BOOK WEEK! Book Week is a wonderful opportunity to celebrate reading for enjoyment, we celebrate books, we celebrate book characters and authors, we celebrate READING. Throughout this week our amazing Teacher Librarian, Jess Marston, has organised a range of activities for our students to participate in with their class and their buddy class through the next two weeks. We have our annual Book Parade on Thursday morning - we look forward to this event every year. Because of the restriction of numbers of adults we can have in our buildings, again we are unable to have parent participation onsite. This is a part of the DoE and our school COVID safety plan. We will, of course share as much of this event with you that we can. Book Week is one of the best weeks of the school year -I can't wait to dress up and celebrate reading and books with our community.


