## CLASS PLACEMENTS for 2022

At the beginning of next week our teachers will begin the process of creating classes for 2022. To do this we take a number of aspects into account in making our decisions, including parent requests, social, emotional and educational needs and student friendships; we give considerable thought to the placement of every student. If you have a specific educational request for us to consider in this process, please contact the Office to request a link to the electronic request form this week (please see last page of the newsletter). These requests will only be considered if they are using the appropriate form, and they must be educationally based.

This **MUST** be completed by this **Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October** so that our process can begin early next week with all relevant information. After this date it is highly likely that we will **NOT** be able to action your request. The process is incredibly complicated – one change has significant effect on student friendships, class numbers, and other parent requests.

We will do our best to meet your educational requests, and where this proves challenging, we will have further discussions with families.

Also, if you are aware that your child/ren (grade 5 2021 and below) will not be attending Hagley Farm School next year please let us know by this **Friday October 22<sup>nd</sup>**, as this information has significant impact on the structure and size of classes, as well as friendship and parent requests.

## SINGFEST

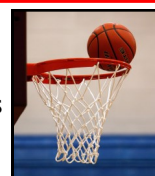

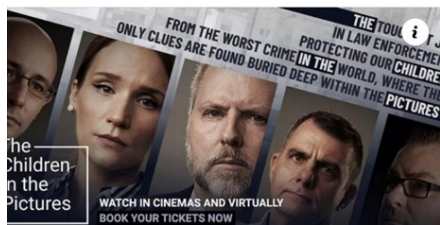
Anyone seen "Children in the Pictures?"

## COVID-19 VACCINATIONS FOR STUDENTS AGED 12 AND OVER

The Tasmanian Government is working hard to provide the COVID-19 vaccination to all Tasmanian's aged 12 and above.

As you may be aware there have been a number of clinics run in colleges to vaccinate students in years 11 and 12. There will also be a small number of regional high schools that will host a vaccine clinic but this is not something that will be occurring at high schools in larger population centres at this point in time.

However, there are a number of different options available for parents to arrange for students aged 12 and above to be vaccinated, these include:

At one of the community clinics across the state. Appointments can be made by visiting [www.coronavirus.tas.gov.au/booking](http://www.coronavirus.tas.gov.au/booking) or calling the Public Health Hotline on **1800 671 738**.

1. At participating GPs - contact your local GP directly to make a booking.

At selected pharmacies - find one near you at [findapharmacy.com.au](http://findapharmacy.com.au)

Vaccination is the best way to protect yourself, your family and the wider community from COVID-19. Don't wait. Vaccinate.

Young people under the age of 16 are encouraged to attend their vaccination appointment with a parent or guardian. ## CLASSES FOR 2022

We are now looking at class structures for 2022. If your child will **not be attending** Hagley next year, can you please let us know as soon as possible, as this will impact on our class placement procedures.

### The Process

Teachers share information related to each students' academic and social needs which is used to create classes.

Students have the opportunity to provide information about other students that they may wish to work with next year.

**Where possible**, students will have at least one nominated friend in their class next year.

If parents have any relevant educational information that they wish to share, this must be in writing through a 'Request for Class Placement' Online Forms Survey. A link is available through the school office.

To receive the link, please fill out the request slip contained in today's newsletter or request one via email.

Students have the opportunity to identify friends, and so parents do not need to list these on the form.

***The online Form should be completed by Friday October 22<sup>nd</sup>.***

### Things to remember

**Only written requests will be considered.**

If you have a particular request, it needs to be submitted each year. Please do not assume that we will remember or continue a request made in the past.

Do not assume that a particular teacher will be teaching a certain grade next year – there is every likelihood that there will be changes for 2022.

Class structures and combinations may well be different in 2022 than this year.

***Please note that while parent requests are considered, it is not always possible to meet a request. The Principal will contact you to discuss your request if necessary.***

### Notification

Class placements are notified to parents with booklists, which will be sent home in the last week of term.

The only review of a student's class placement that will be considered is where a parent believes the above processes have not been followed. Any changes after classes have been finalised only occur in extreme circumstances, as any change may have implications for other students.
