FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hello everyone,

In recent weeks the Hagley Farm Visitor Centre has begun significant work to replace the exterior fencing on our property. This is an enormous task, and one that has been needed for many years – with major concerns about our stock occasionally being out on major roads. This is a very significant financial operation for our Field Study (Visitor) Centre. As a 'centre of excellence' for the Department of Education it is critical that our school farm environment reflects best practice in all areas – our fencing included.

We understand that there has been concern about the removal of the 'Cottage Boys' cement posts from the periphery of the farm. These posts were made in the 1940/50s and we appreciate the significance, heritage and the importance of the boys' work to our farm and our historic culture. However, as a Field Study Centre for the Department of Education, it is critical that Hagley Farm School always displays and exemplifies the best practices of current farming. The cement posts, while having significant importance in the history of our farm, also now have significant safety risk to our farm animals, as they are deteriorating after 80 years of exposure to the elements. Most are deteriorating, and as a Best Practice site the exposure of metal and sharp edges is not acceptable to us to expose our animals and our visitors to.

The history of our school is exceptionally important to our community. I am committed to upholding and respecting our history – while also being focussed on the best practices of farming and the future of agricultural education. I have been liaising with the Tasmanian Heritage Council in the decisions of the renewal of our farm fencing. The Heritage area of the Hagley Farm School is within the school grounds, not in the farm.

To ensure that we continue to honour the 'Cottage Boys' and their contribution to our school we have preserved a number of structurally strong posts. We plan to display them at the entrance of the school to honour them and their work in establishing the school farm. Their contribution to our school and farm environment will not be forgotten - this new display will strengthen the historical importance of the posts.

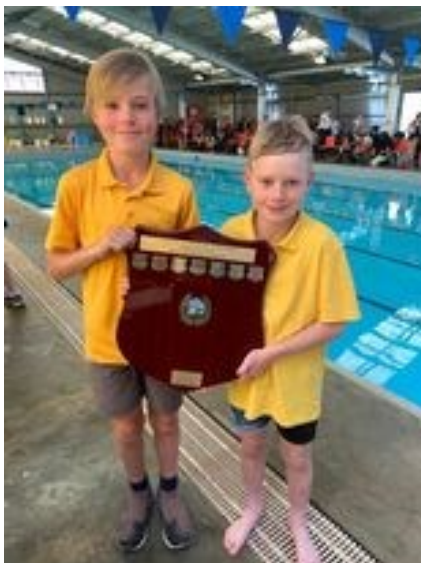


HAGLEY FARM SCHOOL SWIMMING CARNIVAL

BUS FARE INCREASE

The Department of State Growth – Passenger Transport has advised that effective January 2022 the Student/Child cash fare will increase from \$1.80 to \$1.90. Students catching a dedicated school bus can purchase a sheet of 10 tickets for \$15.20 which is a saving of 20 percent. The Smartcard discounted fare will also increase from \$1.44 to \$1.52. Smartcards are only available to those students who travel on a public bus. Some students are eligible for free travel using a Student Bus Pass. Students can check or renew their eligibility by visiting www.transport.tas.gov.au/student Since 2017 the Tasmanian Government's policy has been to increase the student fare by ten cents every second year, where an increase is supported by the Consumer Price Index (CPI). There has not been a student fare increase since 2019 because the fare increase scheduled for 2021 was deferred due to the impacts of COVID-19 on the economy.

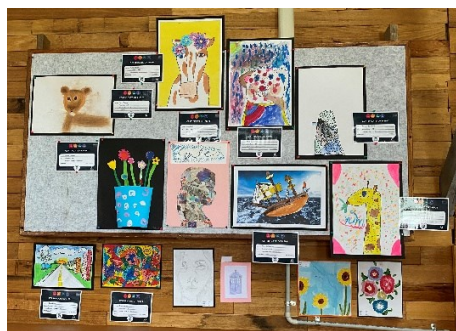
