FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hello everyone,

What a beautiful and courageous performance from our Kinder and Prep students last week for their class Concerts. It was so exciting to watch all students excel in their own way, show courage, growth, and aspiration by learning their roles and performing them so well to an audience of the whole school and then again to a smaller audience while being streamed online. We were very proud of every student and the way they participated in their class performance.

This week we begin the formal acknowledgements and celebrations of outstanding participation and learning at Hagley Farm School. The first of our celebrations is the Grade 3 – 5 Service and Award Presentation Assembly on Friday. Invitations have been sent to parents/carers of the recipients of awards. The reason that we must have a limited audience is that we have limited space, under the Public Health and DoE directions for adults in restricted spaces. Under current directives, we are able to accommodate up to 60 adults in our gymnasium while also having students in the space. For this reason, we limit the number of adults by issuing invitations. I understand that this is frustrating and upsetting to our families. I apologise for this; however, we are doing everything we can to be inclusive during these events while also following the directives from Health and Education.

On Wednesday our Grade 4/5/6 classes will showcase their end of year performance. They have been working hard for a number of weeks to fine tune individual class and combined performances. It is always a fantastic event that we look forward to. Parents have been sent a link to watch the live stream – for the same reasons as mentioned above.

There is so much more happening in the next week and a half. It is such an exciting time for all of our students, while they also have some apprehension about what is coming for next year. Most importantly, our Prep to Grade 5 classes will have a transition meeting with their new teacher (mostly) and new classmates next Monday. Formal information about classes for 2022 will be sent home after this.

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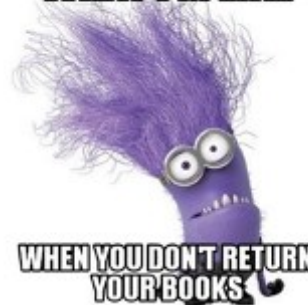

FARM FENCING UPGRADES

You may be aware that we have been upgrading our farm boundary fences recently. Our fences along the Meander Valley Road, Selbourne Road and Church Lane have all received significant work over the past weeks. We have also widened two of our paddock entry gates on Church Lane to allow larger vehicles access to our paddocks.

Last Friday the entry to Baxter Avenue, which leads to the school, was completed and this has really smartened up that area. Fencer Mark Wrangmore was able to utilise some existing 'railway line' post work to design an entrance that pays respect to our history and at the same time gives us a fresh, new look.

The very last part of the work is being completed today and will secure the Murfett's Creek area. Later this month the Meander Valley Council will re-asphalt the footpath alongside the fence.

Along the way we have been able to save a number of our old concrete fence posts built on site during the 1950s and next year Mr Watson will work with our grade 5/6 classes to restore them and set about creating a respectful memorial in Baxter Avenue that again highlights the wonderful agricultural and local history that we are a part of.

Our sincere thanks to Meander Valley fencer Mark Wrangmore and his team from Skid's Fencing, local contractor Leigh Watts from Westbury and Matthew Millwood from the Meander Valley Council for all of their work. We cannot recommend them highly enough!

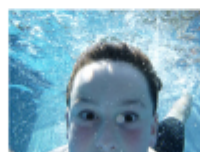
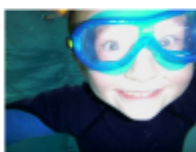
