From the Principal

Hello everyone,

Last week I was privileged to attend the Tasmanian Principal Conference in Devonport. There were many speakers that I learnt from, was inspired by, and want to continue to learn more from. The theme of the Conference was Capturing Hearts and Minds, and Shaping Futures.

For me, the most inspiring speaker during the Conference was Christine Finnegan, the CEO of the Jack Jumpers. The vision that they have and the work that they do to focus on their community is outstanding. The link that Christine made to the Values of the Jack Jumpers community was so relevant to the work that we do at Hagley Farm School to align behaviours and expectations to our School Values. I connected most especially with our Values of Connection, Respect and Responsibility. The JJs work so hard to connect to the Tamanian community and align their values with their work ethic. We want all of our young people to have a strong connection to school, to understand what respect is and be respectful, and be responsible for themselves and their behaviours – and we work hard to support this in each and every student.

Sadly, we see many of our students not connected to school, and as a consequence not attending school regularly. We reach out, we ask why, we try to find ways to support families to improve the attendance of their children. When our students are not at school, we are not able to support their wellbeing and their ongoing learning. We urge every parent to consider how important every day at school is for every child.



Connection, Responsibility and Respect; School, Learning, and Friendship. These are critical elements to be engaged as learners and members of communities. If you would like support or resources to help to improve the attendance of your child at school, please reach out to us. We are here to help.



ATTENDANCE

If your child is away for any reason, it is important to let the school know as soon as practicable. You can send a note, call, email or reply to the text message sent to you the day of the absence.

We are currently at 132 unexplained absences in term 2 so far, a number of these are for days that follow an explained sickness. We are only able to record absences as explained for days that are stated by the parent/carer.

When notifying the school of student absence, each day/date should be given to explain each of the days that the student has been away.

As part of the Department of Education's attendance guidelines, once a student has 5 days of unexplained absences, families will be contacted via a letter.
