In 3/4 Korpershoek we have been working on writing procedural texts. We made Aurora Art to make connections with the Aurora Australis recently and paper lanterns ready for the Winter Solstice on June 21st. Here is a selection of our writing with our art and lanterns that we made.

How to make a paper lantern

Goal: to make a bright and shining lantern for winter

You will need

- One A3 coloured card (any colour)
- two A3 sized pieces of baking paper
- Ten leaves/petals
- pba glue
- Glue stick
- Glue pot
- Glue brush
- Staples
- Scissors
- Ruler




Steps

1. Cut the coloured card into three three centimeter strips.
2. Glue the two of the strips two the side of the baking paper.

3. Turn it over and glue the leafs on with the pba glue.
4. Spread the pba glue on the leafs and the inbtween the leafs.
5. place the other piece of baking paper firmly on the pba glue.
6. Curve the it so it is in a cone shape.
7. Staple the top and boten of the cone.
8. Glue or Staple the third strip of paper to make a handle.

Hint
Stick place a battery powered lite in it and turn it on at night.

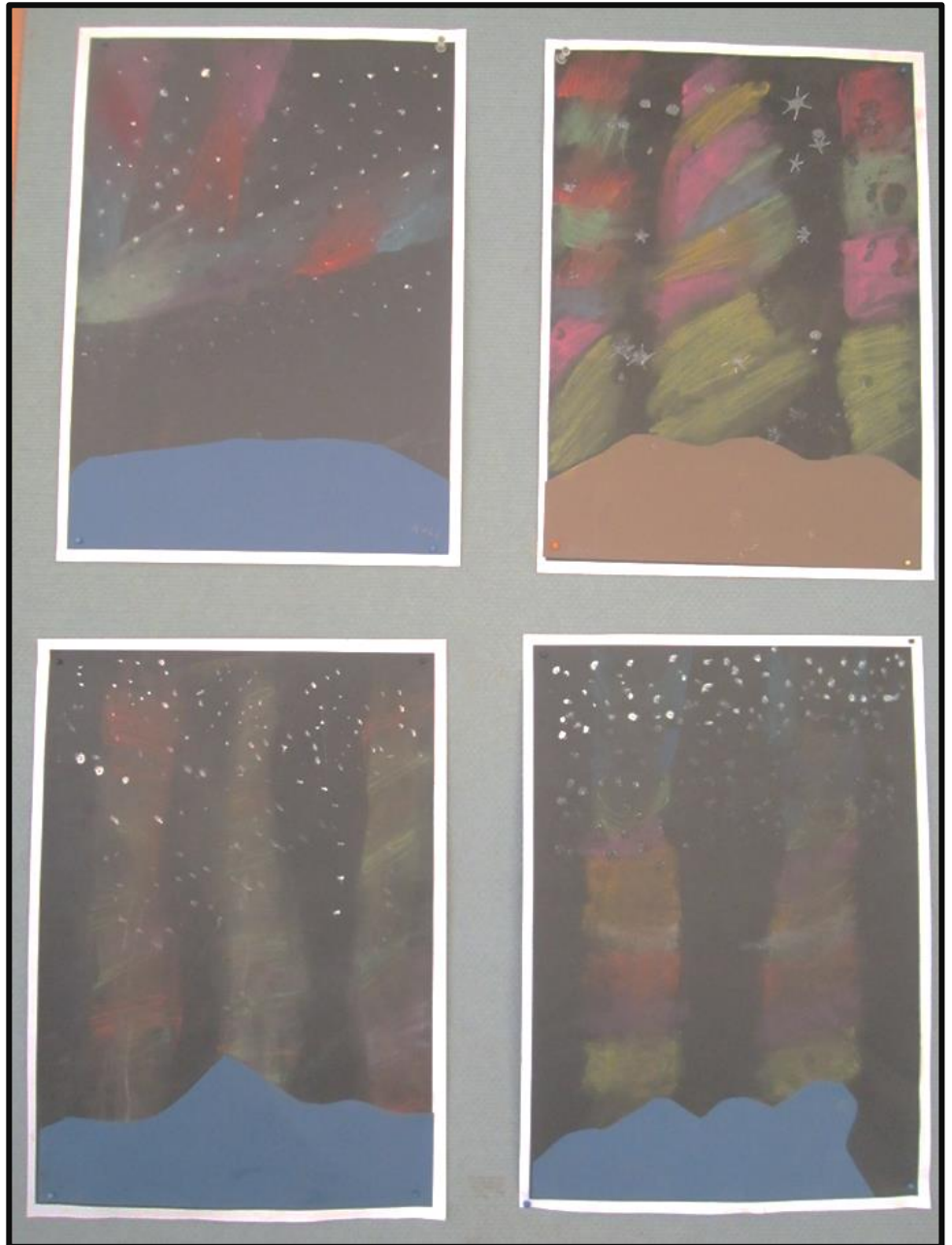
