From the Principal

Hello everyone,

What a fantastic week at Hagley Farm School last week. We celebrated our Welcome Back to School Barbecue on Tuesday afternoon – and what a great evening it was. It was wonderful to welcome the community into our classrooms and to join us in the grounds to enjoy the barbecue and a tractor ride. The ice cream van was a super hit, and maybe we need to consider having two next year, as the lines were so long, I had to intervene so we could get home before dark. Thanks to everyone for joining us, and making the evening such a success.

On Friday we hosted the launch of the 2025 Pollie Pedal, that raises funds for Diabetes Australia. This is a cause close to our hearts, with one of our students being recently diagnosed with Diabetes Type 1. Our Premier and Deputy Premier – Lochlin and Charlie welcomed The Governor of Tasmania, Her Excellency, the Honourable Barbara Baker as she launched the event – and what a thrill that was for us. We witnessed all the ceremony involved in having such a dignitary with us, including a major announcement made by the Equerry, as Her Excellency joined us in the Gymnasium. The students also witnessed and were amazed by the focus of her Equerry formally saluting during the National Anthem and her team standing each time Her Excellency stood or approached her seat. In terms of showing formal respect - it was incredible.

The Deputy Premier, the Honourable Guy Barnett, MP also joined us, as he was a part of the riding entourage. Guy spoke to the students about living with Diabetes, and the 35000 Australians who are diagnosed with Type 1 and Type 2. The most special connection was between Minister Barnett and Charlie as they compared their stories of their diagnosis and how they monitor themselves daily. This was quite a special day for Charlie – meeting the Governor of Tasmania and the Deputy Premier and connecting with them through such a significant event.



At the end of the Assembly, the school students lined the driveway to wave and cheer the 20 riders off on their ride around Tasmania. What a wonderful event to be involved in.

And then on Friday afternoon our Grade 3 – 6 students celebrated the announcement of the 2025 House Captains for Hagley Farm School. This coming Friday our House Captains will take on their new role to lead their Houses and support all students to participate in every event to gain points for their House. NAPLAN 2025

Students will be sitting NAPLAN between 12 and 24 March 2025.

The National Assessment Program-Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are already learning at school. On its own, NAPLAN is not a test that can be studied for, and students are not expected to do so.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process – it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance; however, students and parents may use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.

NAPLAN has been held in March since 2023, having previously taken place in May. This change was made so school systems would have access to results earlier in the school year. These results can then be used to inform teaching and learning plans for the remainder of the year.

Why NAPLAN is conducted online

- NAPLAN online provides a better assessment and more precise results.
- One of the main benefits of NAPLAN online is that it uses tailored (or adaptive) testing. This means that students receive questions better suited to their abilities, so they can show what they know and can do.
- Online testing also allows us to provide a wide range of accessibility options to support students with disability to access NAPLAN.
- Feedback from students is that they find the online test more engaging.
- Please note that students in Year 3 complete the Writing Test on paper.





SCHOOL CARPARK

The School Carpark is always a busy place, most especially at the end of the day. We really appreciate everyone's patience as you come into school for drop off and pick up. Please adhere to our rules for a safe space for families – especially as pedestrians.

- The car park and drop off area can be a bit confusing, especially for new parents. Please look at this map carefully and be mindful of our rules when coming to the school. Please approach the car park slowly at all times our speed limit is 10km/h, and please always give way to buses.
- Please ensure that our students and families walking through the carpark are treated as a priority and given complete safety to walk through. There are paths on either side of the carpark please do not walk in the driving space.
- Please ensure that if you are using our Drop Off and Pick Up area that you are doing just this. This space is for a quick drop off and a quick pick up. Please do not use this space as a waiting area especially at the end of the day. This creates a back log and traffic jam. This then creates parents trying to move through and past the cars that are stopped and it becomes unsafe for everyone.
- If you are an early arrival at the end of the school day, please use the car park spaces to wait, and then use the drive through.
- Please look at the map to ensure you are aware of the expectations of our carpark.
