From the Principal

Hello everyone,

Throughout this term our teaching staff has undergone a reflective process on our Attendance Policy and the Processes that we use at Hagley Farm School. Our teaching staff have huge concerns about the attendance data for our school. Last year our daily average attendance rate was 87%, with the State average being 90%.

At Hagley we have students who have attendance below 50% - that's 100 days away in a school year. We have many students who have attendance below 80% - that's 40 days away each year. We have many students who take an average of a day away from school each week – that's 40 days! We have many students who take regular days away from school without any explanations.

Attendance at school, for all students, is a major focus of the Department for Education, Children and Young People. When students are not at school they miss all planned learning opportunities, they miss the learning interventions that have been planned for them and they miss their connections with their peers and how they belong in our community.

Throughout this year our families will receive an increase in communications from teachers about student attendance, when we are concerned. We will be more vigilant about contacting you to find out why your child is not at school. We will require medical certificates for students who have lots of days away from school. We will communicate regularly to build the attendance stamina of all children.



Please support us to support your child's learning by sending them to school **every day** that they are well.

The DECYP Attendance Policy requires that families should provide information to the school each day when students are away – whether as unwell, or other explanations. We look forward to a positive change, and growth in the attendance for every child.

Reading

This year, we have changed the way we are assessing reading. Many of you may know that we would assess students to know which level they were on. This year we are assessing reading using a screener called DIBELS. DIBELS testing aligns more closely to the skills necessary for successful reading, these include: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, and comprehension.

We will no longer be measuring reading success by a level.

DIBELS testing will tell us if your child is 'at risk' in one or more of the important components of reading.
