From the Principal

Hello everyone,

Welcome to the last few days of term 1. I am astounded by how quickly this term has passed. It seems only a few weeks ago we were welcoming everyone back to school. It has been a busy term with many things to celebrate.

The past two weekends have seen our Grade 5/6 and 3/4 basketball teams participate in the Launceston Schools Basketball Competition. Each team, and individual showed lots of courage, sportsmanship, and determination. Thanks to every coach and manager, over the two weekends, and to Mrs Beams for her organisation to ensure this event took place for our students.

This Friday we will celebrate the term together with a whole school Assembly at 11.10. During this celebration we will acknowledge the students from each class who have shown focus and progress in one or more of our school Values. Parents and carers of these students will receive an invitation to join us, and all other parents and family members are welcome to attend.

I would like to acknowledge the incredibly hard work that our teaching staff have been involved in this term and will continue throughout this year and beyond. As a part of the Department for Education, Children and Young People's priorities, all teachers this year are required to transform their teaching and learning approaches for Reading. They have undergone hours professional learning and support within their classrooms from our Instructional Specialist, Justine Page, to develop new practices that have been identified by the Department as best, evidence based strategies to improve learning in Reading. Along with these changes we have also implemented a significant strategy for intervention for students who have not attained the expected learning in phonics or Word Origins, which involves almost all of our leadership team. They work amongst each grade group every day to support student learning where and when it is needed. This has been a really significant change in our teachers' ways of working, and I congratulate and thank each of them for working together so positively, for working relentlessly to make a difference for the learning outcomes of every student, and for engaging in this steep learning and change together with a growth mindset.

Alongside the teachers are a group of Teacher Assistants and Education Support Specialists who are a part of the intervention support – doing amazing work too. They are all stars, and I am very proud of them all.

I hope that all our students, families and staff enjoy a safe and refreshing few weeks as we prepare for term two, heading into the colder months of the year.

GROWTH & DEVELOPMENT SESSIONS

During Term 2 our school nurse, Amy Bradley will be working with the grade 5/6 students to develop their education and understanding around human growth and development. This education aligns with the Australian Curriculum, HPE unit and each of these lessons contains age-appropriate information, language, and activities.

Grade 5-6 (3- 4 Sessions)

- Puberty physical, social and emotional changes.
- Anatomy- a larger focus on the reproductive system than in Grade 3-4.
- Reproduction- Conception pregnancy and birth.
- Menstruation
- Hygiene
- Protective behaviours, consent and body safety.
- Permission and consent.
- Friendships and healthy relationships.
