Hello everyone,

At Hagley Farm School we work hard to provide opportunities for student voice within our school. Our Student Parliament is the major pathway for sharing student ideas across the school.



Premier's Reading Challenge 2025

The PRC began yesterday. Students will receive a reading log at school this week. We recommend having a reading log at school, and one at home. These can just be combined into one booklet at the end. Spare reading log pages will be available from the library.

This year we have added an option for students from **Grades 1-6.** They can choose to record their books in the traditional way by writing down book titles, or they can use a colour-coded version to show the types of books they are reading. Their initial reading log will have one page of each of these designs. Students can choose the side they prefer or use a combination of both.

Kinder and Prep students have been given a colour-in version – however parents are welcome to request a page to record book titles if they prefer.



Readers' Cup – Congratulations to our Readers' Cup representatives – Paprika, Emilia, Grace and Laura – for their wonderful efforts at the Final.
