Hello everyone,

This is our second last newsletter of the term. It is hard to believe that this term is almost over – it has raced by. Thanks to families who have supported our partnership together throughout the term by being a part of our 3 way parent, teacher and student conversations about learning, participation and engagement and also prioritising attendance at school – the best place for students to be unless they are unwell. News from the Library

Premier's Reading Challenge 2025

A reminder that the PRC started last week. If your child did not receive a reading log, or they need some additional pages, they can visit the library to collect some.

*This year we have added an option for students from **Grades 1-6**. They can choose to record their books in the traditional way by writing down book titles, or they can use a colour-coded version to show the types of books they are reading. Their initial reading log will have one page of each of these designs. Students can choose the side they prefer or use a combination of both.*

Kinder and Prep students have been given a colour-in version – however parents are welcome to request a page to record book titles if they prefer.



Non-Fiction Fun! – This term, we are highlighting students who have enjoyed borrowing a non-fiction (information) book from the library to try something new, or improve their skills. Look for some examples elsewhere in the newsletter.
