From the Principal

Hello everyone

A warm welcome back to Term 3 at Hagley Farm School. We are really excited to be back at school with all of our students and families for this full ten week term. It was fabulous to welcome our students back to school yesterday — so many smiles and obvious pleasure to be back to school, connecting with friends and teachers.

A few changes were really well received by our students and teachers on arrival yesterday. During the holiday we had new and larger bag boxes installed for 5/6 Marshall and Styles, as well as painting the foyer and new glass doors. This has made the arrival space so much more welcoming. It also adds a greater level of ownership and need for respect for the students in a space that has been modified for them.

We have also had a large wooden deck built on the front of Miss Garwood's classroom – facing out into the soccer fields and the swing/barn area. It is an amazing space, and I really look forward to us developing new creative activities to take place there.

This week we will be posting home individual NAPLAN results for our Grade 3 and 5 students who participated in this National Testing earlier in the year. This information is sent to us to distribute to you. NAPLAN is 5 separate tests in 5 learning areas – Numeracy, Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation over a two week period. The information sent to parents gives you a sense of how your child performed on the day in each test. There will be information in the envelope to help to understand the report.

As a school, we value the data that NAPLAN gives us. We receive data that compares our year group students' performance to that of similar schools, as well as the Australian and Tasmanian school averages. We look for patterns which provide us with information about where we need to provide more focus in certain areas of the curriculum. This week our teachers will participate in a session to delve into this data and provide their insight into our strengths and the areas that we need to give more depth in our teaching for all of our students.

If you have a question, concern, or just something to discuss regarding the NAPLAN information, please contact your child's teacher to arrange a time to meet together.

Already this week we have significant levels of staff sickness, and therefore relief teachers and teacher assistants in our school. However, we are also struggling to find enough relief to fill these positions. I hope that this is just an issue for this week, but I doubt that it is. Please understand that when we can not provide relief for a class, we have done everything that we can to find someone, there are just few relief staff available. Where we can, our leadership team will take on teaching relief roles, however, this may result in collapsing classes to enable overall school support.


