Our amazing Teacher Librarian, Mrs Marston, has been preparing for Book Week for months; it includes the Book Parade on Monday, the Book Fair every day and our buddy classes getting together to celebrate reading together.

I can't wait for Monday morning – dressing up and seeing what everyone else has come as is such a thrill. The chatter in the staffroom is all about who is coming as who. I have my outfit organised and ready to go.

We encourage our families to keep the Book Parade outfits as simple as possible – the focus is 'Our favourite character' or 'our favourite book'. 8.30-9.00am – Families are invited to have tea and coffee in the library. Our Book Fair will be on so you can browse while you wait.

9.05am – Families will be able to line the driveway area near the basketball court to watch the outside phase of our Book Parade, as classes walk to the gym. *This will be weather permitting.*

9.25am (Approximately) – The inside phase of our Book Parade will begin in the gym – *staff and students only.*

After the event – photos taken throughout the morning will be made available for families to view. A link will be shared in the newsletter.

*Please remember that our Book Parade is a time to **celebrate and share our favourite books** with our buddy class, and participate in a simple parade. It is not a competition. Children do not have to say who they are dressed up as during the parade. **We love to see costumes that are made from things that you already have at home.** There are thousands of everyday characters featured in our library books, and we encourage non-fiction book choices as well.*

Please remember that our little people need to feel safe – no scary/horror themed costumes, no weapons. No live animals. If in doubt about an element of a costume please check with Mrs Marston.

Changing our approach to teaching reading

Dear parents/carers and families:

You may have noticed some changes in the way we're teaching reading at Hagley Farm School. These changes are part of a statewide commitment to ensure every student develops strong reading skills that will support them throughout school and beyond.

Learning to read is a skill that must be taught—it's not something we're born knowing how to do. That's why our teachers are using high-quality, evidence-based strategies to help every child become a confident reader.

Our students have been learning to read through structured and explicit literacy teaching. This means they are building foundational literacy skills step by step, with each new skill reinforcing the last. This approach helps students grow into capable, independent readers. Our teaching staff began structured phonics learning five years ago and we continue to build upon this foundational teaching. Our Grade 3 to 6's are learning to read and spell words by identifying and understanding the parts of the word. All our teachers are using new strategies to support our students to read various texts.

We're proud to be part of this statewide effort to provide structured literacy lessons that are proven to work. Thank you for your ongoing support as we help every student succeed.

We also still have plenty of Weatherproof Jackets available in all sizes should you wish to purchase one for your child.

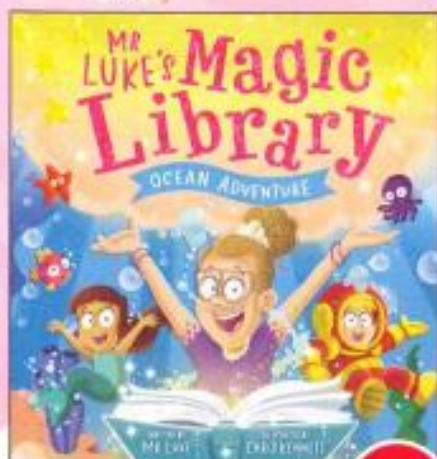
